## OVERVIEW

VET was designed for veterans who want to transition into entrepreneurship after completing their service. Participants in the program will learn from startup companies and industry leaders through hands-on experiential learning, mentorship, and capstone projects. Through the program's business and technology training, participants will be given the tools to turn aspirations into career opportunities and new ventures. Upon successful completion, graduates will earn a VET Certificate NYU Future Labs and Bunker Labs New York.

The VET program will run over the course of 14 weeks.

## CURRICULUM

Each session of the 14-week program will include an in-class lecture on an entrepreneurial subject (product development, sales, accounting, legal, etc.), mentoring by subject matter experts, and start up team collaboration. The program concludes on December 7, 2016 with a Demo Day for the veteran venture teams to present their businesses to investors, government officials, and other stakeholders of the program.

Students accepted into the program will be allowed to work out of the NYU incubators located in Manhattan and Brooklyn during the entirety of the 14 weeks and will be given a suite of complementary resources to propel their ventures.
